Congratulation on winning the recent election. It is a relief to see sanity and decorum return to civic government.

The Toronto Public Library is one of the most admired library systems in the world. It has some of the highest per-capita circulation and visitor numbers of any library network internationally, and provides an essential service to the citizens of Toronto.

Unfortunately, this important resource has been the victim of years of cutbacks, whether by ideological demands to reduce its budget, or by negligent failure to even maintain funding at the level of inflation. The staff have been cut, the hours have been cut, the collections have been cut, and now even security is being cut.

I know someone who has worked in the library system for over 25 years, as both front-line staff and now as a senior manager. He tells me that he has never, ever, seen morale so low. Staff are so overworked and depressed by the continued pressure and deterioration that they are struggling to remain civil with each other.

We cannot allow this destruction of a vital public resource to continue.

Council took an important step during the last budget process when it passed a motion to ask the Library Board to examine ways to re-invest in our public library.

The City Librarian has proposed a funding request for 2015 that is necessary to prevent further cuts to services. However, the outgoing Library Board, populated with Rob Ford appointees, has just voted to reduce that recommended budget request, in clear defiance of Council's direction.

I strongly urge you to reject the Board's proposal and support the budget for 2015 recommended by the City Librarian. I hope that when a new Board is in place in the new year, it will be composed of people who recognize the value, and not just the cost, of a vibrant public library.

A cut or loss in funding will resort in branches having shorter hours, less staff available to help and less accessibility to the libraries and their programs.



Dear Mayor Tory,

Like so many other Torontonians, I am thrilled with your election win and look forward to positive changes in our city.

While it is a mammoth task to try to prioritize spending, I urge you to back up the Public Library system for several reasons:

- 1. Having taught in the public elementary panel in various parts of Toronto for 30 years (now retired), I know that unquestionably there is a link between children's literacy development and their success in school and beyond. School libraries continue to be on the chopping block across the TDSB, and as a teacher-librarian in two different schools I relied upon a partnership with the local library branch to meet the needs of our students. If the public library services are reduced or cut, we run the risk of even higher illiteracy levels. In other words, we need to 'pay it forward' by investing in our children in order to reduce burdens on our systems when our citizens are older.
- 2. With good community partnerships, libraries can also provide safe spaces for children who might otherwise be spending time on the streets or in malls, which can lead to troublesome behaviour. However, it takes money to provide varied, engaging programs and technology in order to draw in pre-teens and young adults. The recent renovation of the Fairview branch is an excellent example of how libraries can be revitalised in neighbourhoods that are being revitalised. The library branch, along with parks and community centres, should be the hub of our communities.
- 3. We cannot ignore the fact that a huge percentage of our city's population is comprised of adults and children whose first language is not English. We currently do not have sufficient services in place for adult English learning and for children's ESL programs in the school system. Again, the public libraries provide resources, technology, and meeting spaces for English language learners, many of whom are living on a low income.


