Eligibility Criteria

Any person who is certified by a recognized authority as having a perceptual disability is eligible for the talking book service. Under the provisions of the Copyright Act, a perceptual disability is one that prevents or inhibits a person from reading works in their original format. It includes such a disability resulting from:

- a. severe or total impairment of sight or the inability to focus or move one's eyes,
- b. the inability to hold or manipulate a book, or
- c. an impairment relating to comprehension
