




Local Library Service, 1960-1968

In September 1959, three weeks after fire destroyed the books in the Children's Room at the Queen and Lisgar Branch, the Toronto Public Library Board opened the Manning Boys and Girls Branch in a two-storey building provided by the Toronto Board of Education on the grounds of Charles G. Fraser School The new branch replaced the children's libraries at Queen and Lisgar Branch, St. Christopher House and Niagara Street and St. Mary's schools. It closed when Sanderson Branch opened in September 1968.

Planning Charles R. Sanderson Branch, 1967-1968

In 1967, the Toronto Public Library Board began to plan for a new branch to serve residents in the area around Bathurst and Dundas Street West. It was to be named in memory of Charles R. Sanderson, who worked at Toronto Public Library for 27 years, from 1929 until shortly before his death in 1956. He is shown here at the opening of East York children's libraries in 1944.





The new branch was designed to house collections for children and young people, with the potential for a future second floor expansion for adult services, should the Central Library (then at College and St. George) be relocated in the future. It was built on land made available through the downtown urban renewal project at Alexandra Park.

When it opened, Sanderson Branch had a collection of over 19,000 volumes, and included such features as a fireplace and one of Toronto Public Library's first colour televisions.




Branch expansion, 1977-1979

In 1977, construction began for a 3,800 square foot expansion as a part of the Scadding Court Community Centre project. The two-million-dollar project was a joint initiative between the Toronto Board of Education, the City's Department of Parks and Recreation and the Toronto Public Library Board.



With the relocation of the entrance to the south side of the building, the branch address was changed to 327 Bathurst Street. The expansion added adult services and collections to the branch for the first time.

Sanderson Branch, 2018 – 50 years of library service



Sanderson Branch is now one of the busiest in Toronto Public Library, and continues to be a cornerstone of a diverse and growing downtown neighbourhood.
